THIS WEEK

This week was Anti-Bullying week. Across the school, we thought about how we value and respect each other and how our actions can affect each other. We discussed what bullying is, remembering that it is repeated, purposeful behaviours that hurt one another. Kindness is our half term value, and this has linked well to our conversations and learning this week. It was lovely to see so many odd socks on Tuesday, showing us that we embrace differences and celebrate what makes all of us unique. It was even more fun to see so many odd socks at the Year 4 Science Museum trip on Tuesday, as other schools that were there were also embracing the same message in odd socks!

It has been a great week in Year 3 focussing on our anti bullying week and culminating in a mufti to support a wonderful cause. We have been learning about bullying this week and what it means. They also learned what to do if they were being bullied or a friend was being bullied, so hopefully they all are well equipped to deal with a situation if it ever arose. Also this week we have continued working on our Fantastic Mr Fox playscripts. The children had great fun filming their scripts using the greenscreen, which linked with the skills taught in their computing lesson. In Maths we have started a unit on multiplication and division with a focus on multiples of 2,3,5 and 10s. Our Rock unit in Science has continued with an investigation into the properties of different rocks. In PE lessons the children have been taught how to run a relay and how to carry out a correct changeover. Over the next few weeks we will start to rehearse our song and poem ready for the wonderful Christmas show in December. In Year 4 three classes enjoyed their visit to the Science Museum this week (with the rest going next week) including a fascinating workshop 'It takes guts!'. In Science, we have been investigating different liquids and their effect on 'teeth' (actually eggshells). We will find out next week which one caused the most damage. Our Literacy work on an information text about the River Thames continues with sections on Hampton Court Palace and Tower Bridge. In maths, we continue to work on length and perimeter and in PE we are improving our Badminton skills.

Year 5 have been very busy with their learning this week! Following on from our Tudor Day excitement, we have spent some time this week looking at Sir Francis Drake and his Golden Hinde. We studied what the boat was like and how these crew members would have lived onboard. During Literacy, we continued on with our Tudor Spy narrative and have reached the very eventual moment where our spy encounters the thief face to face! We have thoroughly enjoyed writing our

dialogue and how the two characters interact in a not so friendly manner. This week has also seen the conclusion of our Multiplication and Division unit in Maths, where we have finished looking at multiplying and dividing numbers by 10,100 and 1000. Most of us have then applied this knowledge to solving some tricky problems and reasoning challenges too. Within Whole Class Reading, we have continued on with our story of 'The Runner' and have immersed ourselves into the book and how the characters are developing through each chapter. We have read more chapters and are very excited to see how this story unfolds. Our PE lessons have seen us working on our basketball skills. We have focussed on having greater control of the ball and being able to dribble with it effectively. The lessons have seen us playing various games to practise our skills and have also worked on our teamwork too! Another very busy and fantastic week in Year 6. In Science, the children have continued their new topic of Evolutions and Inheritance, the children had their first lesson looking at the basics of how genetics works using counters to explain how we vary to our siblings. In Maths, we have been continuing with Fractions, looking at how to convert between improper fractions and mixed numbers and how to add /subtract fractions with different denominators. In Literacy, pupils have now written their first three paragraphs of their narrative, based on the short video named 'Origins'. They have used descriptive language, across and show not tell to convey this. Most Year 6 pupils have completed a 3D clay tile of their design with beautiful outcomes - well done! Whilst other classes have begun their DT unit (Victorian Samplers) having researched what they were and why they were made. Finally, in Computing, we have started our unit on 3D printing much to the excitement of the pupils. They have begun using the tutorials on Tinkercad to help them understand the concept and how to design using the programme.

Considering we were one of the only schools taking part, this is a fantastic achievement.
