THIS WEEK

Thank you for all your generosity for our Comic Relief collection this week. We have raised an amazing total of £1,020.86 including £361 from the Cleves Joke Book! Many thanks to Miss Childs and the School Council for organising this for us. We hope you are 'entertained' all weekend with the 'hilarious' jokes that the children have come up with.

We hope you have found the meetings with your child's teacher useful and enjoyed looking at the children's books. I know they enjoy sharing all of their work with you.

This week, Year 3 has been diving into some exciting new learning! In English, we've started recount writing based on Saint George and The Dragon, focusing on storytelling and key writing techniques. In Whole Class Reading, we are continuing our journey with Lottie Lipton, while in Maths, we are wrapping up our work on Fractions. We finished the week finding fractions of a number. In Science, we have been learning about how water moves through plants. We discovered that plants absorb water through their roots, which then travels up the stem to reach the leaves and flowers. To see this in action, we carried out a fun experiment using lettuce leaves and coloured water - over time, we observed the colour moving through the veins of the leaves, showing how water is transported! In History, we've been comparing life in Britain during ancient times with life in Ancient Egypt, discovering fascinating similarities and differences. In PE, gymnastics has been all about improving different jumps using equipment, helping us build strength and coordination. Meanwhile, in PSHE, we've been discussing job stereotypes and setting goals for the future. To round off the week, we celebrated Red Nose Day! This special event is all about coming together to have fun while making a difference. We raised money to support charities that help people in the UK and around the world, tackling important issues such as poverty, homelessness, and mental health. It's a chance for us to show kindness, generosity, and teamwork - all while wearing our red noses with pride! We have had a lovely week in Year 4, reassuming normal timetables! The children have written amazing Haiku, Cinquains and rhyming couplet poems all about Spring. In Maths, we have continued to learn about tenths, using numbers lines. We continue to learn about sound in Science, exploring different instruments and how we can change and alter pitch. We enjoyed some lovely weather yesterday for our games sessions, learning various different skills for sports such as football, hockey and netball. We loved seeing everyones homework on their significant buildings inspired by Hundertwasser. In Art, we looked at a new technique and created some lovely paint work, exploring texture. In Computing, we are taking it in

turns to use the LEGO Milo Rovers and the children are enjoying learning how to code.

Another action packed week in Year 5 has just passed! The children have completed their own chapter for The Firework Maker's Daughter - this has been copied into special writing books and looks amazing. Next week, we will be starting an exciting literacy unit! Within PSHE, classes have been discussing different jobs and sections - these have brought on some very interesting conversations. During Science, we discussed Galileo's famous hypothesis that objects with different masses reach the ground at the same time. The children greatly enjoyed carrying out their own experiment to prove this. Within Maths, we have been combining our learning over the past couple of weeks to discuss how to convert and compare fractions, decimals and percentages. It was great to end the week with the sea of red that faced us! Another busy week in Year 6 this week where we have been working hard across all lessons. We have enjoyed exploring how the eye works in Science. We have also been looking at energy production in Topic, exploring fossil fuels, renewable energy and the impacts these have on the environment. Finally, we have started looking at ratios and scale factors in Maths.

We continue with celebrating great behaviour and standards across the school in our Celebration Assembly. We have been particularly impressed by the improvement in lunchtime behaviour in the canteen where children have been going out of their way to make the space as pleasant as possible for the children coming later in the lunch hour.


Tag Rugby Friendlies
