IMPORTANT REMINDER

Air Tags have an anti stalking device on them that alerts iphone users close by as to their presence and by clicking on them this shows where the air tag has been. This is a safeguarding risk and while we review our policies in regards to this technology we are asking that, just as with mobile phones, children do not have Air Tags on them during school trips.

This week we have been very lucky to invite a literacy consultant into school to look at where we are in Literacy and discuss how we can further develop the learning experience of our children. It has been fantastic to show what we do and to celebrate our excellent teachers, as well as have open discussions about what lies beyond 'outstanding'. It is testament to our teaching staff that they constantly want to look at new opportunities and research that will increase the opportunities for each and every one of our children. Thank you to them all for their dedication and openness, and thanks to Mrs Smith and Mrs Cannell for all their work in leading this visit.

Today, we also bid farewell to Mrs Clements, our School Business Manager. She has been an invaluable support as we joined the school and her knowledge pool knows no limit! She will be missed by many here, and we wish her all the best in her relocation. We are also lucky to be able to share that Mrs Thomson, our Finance Officer, has been successful in the role of School Business Manager and has already started taking on the role.

We have had a busy and exciting week of learning in **Year 3**! In Literacy, we've just finished our unit on instructions and have been writing them up in our special writing books, making sure to include all the features of instructional texts. In Maths, we've moved on to a new unit focusing on measurements of length, where we've been practising how to convert and compare measurements between mm, cm, and m. In Science, we've been using our pattern spotting skills to investigate how the size of a shadow changes with distance. In Computing, we've been putting our coding skills to the test by creating our own algorithms. In RE, we've continued our exploration of Islam, learning about the significance of Rak'ah in Islamic prayer. Finally, in Design Technology, we've been busy creating our own posters for kitchen safety in preparation for cooking our own falafel next week—everyone is so excited! Everyone has been working hard in **Year 4** this week to finish their final drafts of Theseus and the Minotaur. With the Hot Task write up session on Monday, who knows who may receive the next pen passport? In Maths, we've pushed ourselves to complete challenges involving dividing three digit numbers, and we're now set for the next big unit: FRACTIONS! We continue to enjoy learning about the Ancient Greeks and we cannot wait to find out what happens in the final chapter of The Iron Man next week...

This week, **Year 5** have started to write their voiceover about the Apollo 11 moon landing in Literacy. Relating to Space, the children have been learning about the different phases of the moon in Science. In Maths, the year group has started fractions, which will be the focus over the next few weeks. In Computing, three classes have programmed a LEGO rover using I pads and code. The other half of the year group will start this next week. **Year 6** have had a creative, hands on and fun week! We have been looking at analysing the features of a recipe and then followed these instructions to cook our very own yummy pizzas in DT. We have finished off our Spooky Stories unit in Literacy, which we have thoroughly enjoyed and am sure the teachers will be having nightmares after reading! And finally, in Computing, we have been tinkering and learning how to use Adobe Express.

I wanted to start this week's round up by apologising for cancelling our lunchtime clubs that take place on our field this week. Due to the recent rainfall, the field is in dreadful condition and just when we have a couple of days of dry weather, it then rains torrentially again like it has done today.
