This week, we have been very lucky to celebrate the learning of the children that have been learning an instrument through Surrey Arts' Tuning Up programme. This has included learning violin in Year 3, toots in Year 4, trumpets in Year 5 and clarinets in Year 6. Each term two classes learn a new instrument, meaning that over the course of their four years at Cleves, they will have played instruments from each section of the orchestra. It has been lovely to celebrate their musical achievements, however it has also been incredibly positive to be able to see other areas of development: listening, collaboration, perseverance, stamina and most importantly, confidence. **Year 3** have been getting very festive this week. Not only have we had rehearsals for our Christmas show next week, but we have started making our christmas stockings. Thank you to all the parents and carers that have volunteered to help this week and next, your help is invaluable. We have started our last literacy unit of the year, a creative narrative based on The Polar Express. We have also started a new unit this week on statistics, with a first look at pictograms. Year 3 have read and interpreted the data on the pictograms and created their own. In computing we have been focussing on copying and pasting text into a Google Doc and then manipulating size, font and colour, adding pictures etc. Year 4 - This week saw the first rehearsal in the church for next week's nativity. We have been practising our song and poem hard! We have also started a new Literacy unit based on Letters from Father Christmas by JRR Tolkien. We will be writing a narrative based on the exploits of the North Polar Bear and the havoc he causes. In Science, we have been learning about how to keep our teeth and gums healthy which we will be using for our weekend homework task. In Geography we have looked at the history of the River Thames. In Maths we have been looking at our 7 and 11 times tables so lots of tackling tables needed!

This week in **Year 5**, we have been working incredibly hard on finishing off our Literacy work on the Letters from the Golden Hinde. We have thoroughly enjoyed immersing ourselves into life aboard the ship and the jobs it would have entailed. We have written out informal letters back home describing what it really would have been like as part of Sir Francis Drake's crew! During Maths, we

have moved onto our statistics unit and have spent some time looking at various graphs and charts. In our lessons, we have tried to interpret data and understand the key information that they show in order to answer some tricky challenge questions. Topic this week has seen us look into the life of Sir Walter Raleigh and his several journeys as an explorer and privateer. We then created some very interesting videos on the iPads detailing the benefits of exploring during Tudor times! With our PE lessons, we have continued on with our basketball unit and have tried to work on the attack and defend phases of the sport. We have looked at marking and movement and how this can benefit us in game situations. Some of us have really shown fantastic basketball dribbling and shooting skills! Finally, we have continued on perfecting our exciting Christmas Songs and Poems in preparation for the upcoming concert. We can't wait to perform it to everyone very soon! Well done Year 6 for your resilience and hard work. Everyone is tired or feeling unwell. Christmas festivities are in full swing as we practice our songs and poems ready for the celebration on Wednesday 18th. In Maths, we have had Review week, revisiting relevant areas of Maths. We also ended the week completing an investigation, 'Four 4s', in which children use four 4s and BODMAS to find answers of 1-20! Following on from using a clip from 'A Christmas Carol' to teach how to combine action, description and dialogue, the pupils are now using these skills. We are using a wonderful John Lewis advert (Excitable Edgar and Ava) on which they base their narrative. Pupils have come to the end of the unit on Evolution and Inheritance and are revising. Pupils have been thoroughly enjoying a DT project in using cross stitch to create their Victorian Sampler there are some excellent designs coming together! Finally, Year 6 have designed their personal 3D keyring and these will be printed over the next two weeks!

#### **Border League Cross Country**

Last Sunday saw the second Border League Cross Country fixture of the season, hosted by Maidenhead Athletic Club. It was another hugely successful and enjoyable afternoon of running for our athletes, which saw over 50 running in the Cleves vest.
