

We have enjoyed a wonderful celebration of reading with World Book Day. Children and staff alike enjoyed dressing up and participating in book related activities throughout the day. Many thanks to you all for your support in providing some spectacular costumes and to staff for organising

some amazing activities. See below for some photos of the day.

Thank you also to everyone for their support and kind words this week. I've been overwhelmed by the support I've received from the school community. It has been greatly appreciated.

We've had a fantastic and engaging week in **Year 3,** filled with creativity, exploration, and a love for learning! This week, we unleashed our imaginations by designing our own dragons! The children worked hard to create detailed descriptions of their mythical creatures, thinking about their appearance, special powers, and habitats. Alongside this, we focused on how to structure our writing using subheadings, helping us to organise our ideas clearly into different paragraphs. It was wonderful to see the children take pride in their writing and to start to bring their dragons to life with fantastic vocabulary! Whole Class Reading -Our journey with Lottie Lipton and the Secrets of the Stone continued this week, keeping us all on the edge of our seats! We explored new vocabulary, including the word curator, why not ask your child if they remember what it means? We also looked at the different clues Lottie discovered and discussed how they helped her solve the mystery. The children have been making excellent predictions and showing great detective skills! In Maths, we focused on division, focusing mainly on grouping and repeated subtraction to help solve problems. We also explored what happens when numbers don't divide exactly, learning how to find remainders. To make this more visual and interactive, we used lolly-pop sticks to help us group and count what was left over. This hands-on method made it easier for the children to see division in action and develop a deeper understanding of remainders. Our Science lesson this week marked the start of an exciting new experiment! We began learning about how plants grow, with a focus on spring onions. The children discussed what plants need to thrive and made predictions about what they think will happen in the coming weeks. We will be carefully observing any changes and recording our findings as the experiment progresses - stay tuned for some exciting results! Our exploration of Ancient Egypt took us to the banks of the River Nile this week, as we learned just how important it was to the Ancient Egyptians. We discussed how the river provided water, food, transport, and fertile land for farming, and the children were fascinated by how it shaped Egyptian life and culture. Finally, World Book Day! What an amazing day we had celebrating our love of books and reading! Year 3 looked fantastic dressed as characters from Fantastic Mr. Fox and we spent the day exploring new vocabulary, getting creative and reading with other year groups. The children particularly enjoyed sharing their favourite books and stories, reinforcing the joy that reading brings. It was wonderful to see them so engaged and excited about literature! Parent Consultations: Please don't forget to book a slot for our upcoming parent consultation day on Friday 21st March. This is a great opportunity to discuss your child's progress and achievements so far. What a week we have had in **Year 4**. 4L and 4FA thoroughly enjoyed the sunshine on our first trip to Butser Farm. They enjoyed some archeology, weaving and exploring Roman Villa's and round houses. Meanwhile, 4W and 4R enjoyed their Iron Man making day and 4E and 4M were busy bird watching for Outdoor Learning. We also loved World Book Day, especially when the Year 4 teachers won best dressed as Harry Potter professors! We made exploding books, tiles for a display and created masks based on the Midnight Panther. What a busy week!

We are fully back into the swing of learning in **Year 5**. Within Maths, we have started a new unit on decimals where the children have been going over what they are and how to find equivalent decimals. We have started our Literacy unit on the Firework Maker's Daughter, which is a book we started looking at before half term. The children have enjoyed drafting Lila's journey back through the jungle to save her father! We continue to look at the force of gravity within Science and discuss how the Moon stays in orbit around the Earth and doesn't fall towards us. The children continue to enjoy our Lacrosse unit in PE, which for many is a brand new sport, it is great to see the perseverance across the board. Finally, there has to be a special

mention given to our activities on Thursday, where the children looked amazing! The children enjoyed learning about Bok, helping to create a whole year group display and reading to our Year 3 children, to name a few activities. We have had a great hands on week in **Year 6!** We loved our World Book Day where we created poems based on the famous poem 'if all the world were paper', we participated in some drama activities and quizzes based on famous books and we created our own piece of art inspired by our favourite book. Also, in PE this week, we have used the Lion King show and the brilliant choreography to inspire and guide our new dance unit. Finally, in Science we have started our new unit on Light, exploring how light reflects.
