Key Findings

- The 10 pupils eligible for FSM was very low compared to that nationally. Out of the 10 pupils, 3 were on the SEND register as SEND Support.
- Progress made for these pupils were significantly above national (0) in reading (4.03) above in writing (1.85) and only just below in Maths (-0.64)
- Average Scaled Scores for PPG children are significantly above PPG national in reading and GPS and just below in Maths.
- % of PPG children achieving the expected standard above PPG national in reading, writing and GPS and just below in maths (note 1 child = 10%)
- % of PPG children achieving the high standard above PPG national in reading, writing and GPS and again just below in maths

Key Findings

- Numbers of pupils eligible for PPG is low or very low compared to nationally.
- In the majority of cases, the attainment (APS) of PPG children is at, above or only marginally below expected age related expectations.
- The internal data shows that the attainment gap in the upper school between PPG pupils and Non PPG pupils is closing when compared to results in 2014/15 and 2015/16
- In many cases the attainment of PPG pupils is only marginally below the attainment of Non PPG pupils demonstrating the impact of the ongoing targeted provision for this group of pupils.
- The average progress of PPG pupils since KS1 is largely similar with 5 areas only marginally less than that of Non PPG pupils and 5 areas marginally above that of Non PPG pupils. This demonstrates the impact of this being a continued whole school priority.
- The table showing the % of PPG pupils making expected progress evidences that in most cases the majority of this group made three points progress during the academic year. In fact many of these pupils made greater than three points progress.
- For the 2015 intake, PPG children making expected progress in maths will now be a focus.
- The progress made by PPG pupils during 2016/17 academic year is broadly similar or often better than Non PPG pupils. In Years 4 and 6, progress of PPG pupils was greater in all three subject areas than that of Non PPG pupils. This is evidence of the closing attainment gap between PPG and Non PPG pupils as they move through the school.
