THIS WEEK

Welcome back! We hope you've all had a lovely summer break. Our first week has been hugely enjoyable and we would like to congratulate all of the children on making such a great start to the term. The children seem delighted to be back and have all made a positive start; enjoying the new improved meal offer in the dining hall, catching up with friends in the playground and meeting new faces in their classes. In particular though, we would like to congratulate our new year 3 pupils who have been calm, polite and confident. They appear happy, friendly and well prepared for school.

Year 3 has had a fantastic first week settling into life at Cleves - well done! We have done lots of bonding activities in class starting to get to know the children and giving them opportunities to start getting to know one another as well. We have been talking about the qualities that make a good friend as well as going on another tour of the school to remind children of their surroundings. We have been talking about our personal attributes, such as being helpful or funny, and creating 'exploding photographs'.

In maths, we have been collecting data on class birthdays and presenting it in bar graphs. We have also been counting in 2s, 5s and 10s and recognising the value of each digit in 3 digit numbers. In literacy, we have started our poetry unit linked to school experiences. We have been reading and listening to the poem 'Please Mrs Butler' and, by the end of the next two weeks, will have written our own list poem about school.

In PSHE, we have started our 'Rights Respecting' lessons and have been discussing the differences between wants and needs as well as the role of Unicef. In addition, we have been learning about the UN Convention of the Rights of a Child and discussing what rights children have, such as having the right to an education and the right to be treated fairly. Next week, we will be discussing the responsibilities that come with these rights and creating our class charters.

We also had our first PE lesson this week and practised getting changed before playing different team games.

Please could we ask that children continue to practise doing their ties, top buttons and shoelaces so they can become more confident and independent.

What an exciting first week back at school! We have all settled in brilliantly and can't believe we are now in **Year 4!** After we found our new seats in our classrooms, most importantly were allocated our lockers and got to know our teachers, we started our first Literary unit. We are looking at the book 'Grandpa Chatterji' by Jamila Gavin, exploring the different character traits of Grandpa Leicester and Grandpa Chatterji.

In Maths we have started our Place Value topic, understanding the relationship between, ones, tens, hundreds, thousands, tens of thousands and all the way up to millions!

In Geography we have started learning about Rivers to prepare us for our upcoming River Trip. Though the rain was not on our side this week, we still had fantastic fun in our PE lessons, learning about relay races and working together as a team. What a great start to what we know will be an unforgettable year!

What a busy but fantastic first week we have had in **Year 5**! We have dived straight into our learning and have settled in exceptionally well. We have jumped into our new and exciting unit on Mega City in our Literacy lessons, where we have focussed on building descriptive sentences and adding show not tell. Within Maths, we have started our first unit on Place Value and in Games, we completed some pace judgement running. Our Tudor topic started with a lesson on the Monarchs from 1066 to the beginning of the Tudor era, learning about the Magna Carta and then looking at the 'Black Death'.

Year 6 have had a fantastic first week back and have launched into our new topic about the Victorians. We have completed a timeline of the monarchs of the Stuarts and Hanover eras, thus bridging the gap between our knowledge of the Tudors (Year 5) and Victorians. We have also enjoyed learning about key events during these periods including the Gunpowder Plot and the Great Fire of London!

In maths, we are busy revising place value and securing our knowledge through developing our reasoning and problem solving skills. We have also started our new literacy unit based on the book

'Street Child' by Bertie Doherty. In art, the children have been introduced to the works of William Morris and we are enjoying our new gymnastics unit in PE. In addition to all this, each class is busy reading and voting for their best book in our 'World Cup of Books' challenge.

The children have already surpassed our expectations with their learning behaviours and have shown they are all ready for the exciting challenges of Year 6.

Google Chromebooks


