It has felt very festive at school this week with each class busy practicing their Christmas performance ahead of their filming. It was then great to see everyone dressed in Christmas jumpers today - thank you for contributing towards this important school fundraising event. Thank you in advance for also supporting the other PTA Christmas events taking place over the next week - in particular our Santa Run next Tuesday which we are really looking forward to!

Like in so many schools locally, the number of cases of coronavirus show no sign of decreasing with outbreaks across a number of classes. We do however believe that the measures we have put in place following guidance from Public Health England are helping to contain a more serious outbreak. We will continue to monitor the situation very closely in the final week of term and we hope that the gap over Christmas will allow a 'circuit break' so that we can return to more normality in the new year.

It's been another action-packed week in **Year 3** as we 'steam' towards the end of the children's first

term at Cleves. We are continuing to enjoy our creative descriptive literacy unit based on The Polar Express and, this week, have been planning and writing a detailed description of the Polar Express arriving at its final destination - The North Pole and the arrival of Santa as well as the sights and sounds the group of children experience. We have been concentrating on using effective language to really capture the atmosphere and the magic using the film and still images to help us. In our whole class guided reading sessions, we have also been looking at an extract from a festive book, The Boy Called Christmas by Matt Haig. We've been discussing what we know about the main character, Nickolas, and where he lives as well as picking out some new vocabulary. In maths, we've been revisiting some of the objectives from this half term including column addition and subtraction involving exchanging as well as money and, more specifically, calculating change. In Geography, we have been learning about the term 'climate' and how it is different to the weather. We have also been learning about different climate zones around the world before focusing on the climate in the UK. We have also spent time rehearsing and filming our class poems and songs for the Nativity performance which will be available to view soon (more details will follow) - we'd like to thank all of the children for their efforts learning their lines and lyrics and to all of the adults for helping with this and for organising costumes - it's much appreciated! Year 4 have had a busy penultimate week. We've started our new literacy unit which uses 'The Letters From Father Christmas' by J.R.R. Tolkien, as a basis for our writing. The children have been reading letters about the North Polar Bear and the trouble he caused Father Christmas, we will soon be writing a descriptive narrative to describe the beautiful setting and adventures of the letters. In science, we have continued to learn about the digestive system and it's functions whilst in geography we have been looking at dams, barrages and weirs and their functions - in particular; Thames Barrier and the Farakka barrage in India. We have also continued to develop our recyclable bags and hope to have them finished for Christmas. Finally, we filmed our Christmas song and poem on Wednesday. All of the performances were outstanding and we really look forward to sharing this with everyone.

What a busy week we have had in **Year 5**! As we close in on Christmas, we have been working very hard to cover all of our remaining lessons on the Twelfth Night in Literacy. We have finished off our playscripts and even had a chance to act some of them out using our shakespearean language! Within Maths, we have moved on to looking at statistics and have been learning about reading and drawing graphs. Our topic lessons have seen us look at detail about Queen Elizaebeth and the success of her reign. We are nearing the end of our thoroughly enjoyable Scratch unit in computing, where all of us have nearly finished creating our projects and working collaboratively! Year 6 have started our final Literacy unit of the term, using the John Lewis "Excitable Edgar" advert to inspire our Christmas narrative and dialogue between a girl called Ava and her best friend, Edgar (a little green dragon). In Science, we have been drawing our evolution and inheritance unit to a conclusion by reviewing all of our learning, and Computing has seen us learning how to make our internet searches more efficient and accurate. In DT, everyone is now fully underway practising their cross stitch, creating Victorian-style Christmas samplers. Any spare moments have been spent rehearsing for the Christmas performance video which we'll be filming next week!
