You may be aware that there have been changes in terms of what schools are expected to do in order to ensure attendance is as good as possible. As a result, we have been working on updating our Attendance Policy and will share it with parents & carers as soon as possible. However, it is important that everyone understands our vision for attendance is that 'every child attends everyday'. There is an expectation that we use all the tools at our disposal to achieve this, including requesting 'Penalty Notices' where appropriate. This is not something the school has done in the past but we will be open to using such measures if necessary. It is important that you know that schools do not receive the money where fines are issued and the decision to actually issue a fixed penalty notice remains with the local authority.
