This year we introduced the GAP Club Charter which everyone, from pupils to staff, signed. It helps us to remind ourselves how we should behave and how we want others to behave. It's always good to keep reminding ourselves now and again. It is posted around GAP for everyone to see and at our GAP reception for parents too.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- GAP Club runs from 3.15pm to 6pm Monday to Friday
- Year 3 & 4 (lower school) will now sign in at the GAP reception desk (round the side of the Year 3 block along the pathway running directly opposite to Oatlands Avenue). Please note: New Year 3 children pupils will be collected from their classroom at the end of the day for the first week by a GAP playworker until children feel safe and secure to take themselves. Please ensure all Year 3 & 4 pupils know what's going to happen and where to go. This is also where parents need to come when collecting their children.
- Year 5&6 (upper school) will continue to sign in at GAP in the school Dining hall so nothing changes for them from a sign-in point of view. <u>Pupils should make their own way there</u>.
- We will operate slightly differently in that we are now going to turn the atrium into our food hall. Year 3 &4s will sign in and immediately enter the food hall to have their snack and drink. As soon as they are all finished we will then move them out into the unstructured activities area in the hall and move the Year 5&6s in. This will all help with the flow of pupils during the session. This part of the session will be from 3.15-3.45pm. After this, pupils are then allowed to choose which play area they would like to go to and we ensure they get from A to B safely and securely. All pupils MUST ask a member of staff when they want to move from one area to another..
- All payments are made via scopay and accounts will be updated by w/c 5th September. Each session costs £13 which includes a snack and drinks. A menu is located in GAP reception if parents or children want to see the options.
- Any children attending clubs will be taken and collected by a playworker so they

- MUST come directly to GAP and sign in first.
- Whether attending a club or not ALL pupils must be signed out of GAP first and foremost. That means, if you want to pick your child up directly from a club then you must come and sign them out of GAP in the first instance so we know responsibility has been handed over.



Every year we invest in new equipment based on the activities we want to introduce or re-run but we are always extremely grateful for any unwanted dvds (PG) games or toys that are still in good condition but just not needed any more at home.
