Sports Newsletter - 18th December 2024

Welcome to the second of our half termly sports newsletters. It has been another very busy, successful and active half term of sport at Cleves so there is plenty to report on. The newsletter also looks ahead to events coming up in the spring term which includes information on how to get your child involved.

This term we have had 530 pupils regularly attending an extracurricular club. This includes a club run by one of our teachers before school or at lunchtime or one that is provided by one of our after school providers. These are exceptional numbers and show the value that the school, pupils and parents place on physical activity. This term we have offered clubs in a wide range of areas and we have even more planned for 2025!

On top of this, 361 pupils have already represented Cleves in sport in a competition or festival against another school this term. Our aim is to be able to offer this to every child across the school and we are certainly on track. Congratulations to all that have done so already, I have been hugely impressed with your commitment, effort and skill level. We've been really successful this term but I hope it's been equally enjoyable.

GIRLS FOOTBALL AWARD - EQUAL ACCESS SCHOOL 2024

I am delighted to share with you that we have recently won the Equal Access School 2024 award for equal access and opportunities in girls' football. Breaking barriers and scoring goals both on and off the pitch, this recognition is a testament to the Cleves' commitment to gender equality and empowering young female athletes.

This is a prestigious award, recognising our outstanding commitment to provide equal opportunities for both girls and boys to participate in football.



WWHSP PARTNERSHIP

With Cleves taking the lead on the Walton, Weybridge and Hersham Sports Partnership, we have continued to host, organise and lead a number of sporting festivals this half term. This includes a year 3 mini olympics competition which 3HM and 3J took part in and a year 2 mini olympics which we ran for the local schools in the area. We also hosted a dodgeball



festival which saw us enter teams in both Year 4 and Year 6. More on this below! In the spring term we have further mini olympics festivals planned together with a Year 5/6 football festival, tag rugby and sportshall athletics competitions.

SPORTS CREW

Following their training at the beginning of term, the Year 6 sports crew have been busy in their roles. They have a timetable in place where they set up games and activities for our year 3 pupils on the playground at lunchtime and they have also been involved in hosting and running the Mini Olympics festivals that we have led on as part of

RUNNING CLUB

We continue to have over 150 pupils attending our Tuesday morning running club every week which is fantastic. Just a reminder that we are once again challenging our pupils to run a marathon across the course of the year. All they need to do is attend 18 sessions before Easter (not consecutively) to be awarded with a medal at the end of the year.

Our special Santa run was very well attended on Tuesday and it was great to see so many Christmas accessories. Unfortunately, I wasn't able to add the photo that was taken due to photo permissions but everyone did have a great time and looked very festive!

NETBALL FIXTURES

In November, both the Year 5 and Year 6 netball teams were in action with their first league games against Cardinal Newman school. Both teams played brilliantly with Cleves coming away with victories in both matches. Y5 won their game 7-0 and Y6 team's final score was 11-0. CROSS COUNTRY

We've already had nearly 100 pupils represent the school in cross country this academic year and, once again, it's clear we have a large number of talented and committed athletes.

The first Border League Cross Country Competition took place in Guildford at the beginning of November. We had over 80 athletes running in the Cleves vest and they were all brilliant. We won both the under 11s boys and girls competition and were runners up and 3rd in Under 9s boys and girls competition. Considering we were one of the only schools taking part, this is a fantastic achievement. Individually well done to the following who secured top 10 finishes in their races - Chloe G (7th), Ralph H (3rd), Rowan M (8th), Sebbi S (2nd), Freddie T (4th), Will D (10th). Then, the day after, 24 athletes took part in the cross country relay event at Notre Dame School. The format saw athletes compete in teams of 6, each running 600m of the Notre Dame cross

country course. All of our runners were brilliant with Cleves winning the year 5 girls, year 5 boys and year 6 boys event and coming third in the year 6 girls competition. Congratulations!

At the beginning of December, the second Border League Cross Country fixture of the season took place in Maidenhead. It was another hugely successful and enjoyable afternoon of running for our athletes, which saw over 50 running in the Cleves vest. The conditions underfoot were very slippery which led to proper cross country conditions.

In the team events we were runners up in the Under 9s boys, Under 9s girls and Under 11s girls, whilst in the Under 11s boys event we were once again overall winners.

Recently, eight of the Year 5 and 6 girls travelled to Fulham's training ground to take part in a 6 a-side football tournament. Each team played 3 matches in one of 4 groups, with the top of each group moving on to the next stage of the competition. The girls were eager to start and were the better side in their first match against Cheam Fields, but the game ended in a 1-1 draw. We then knew that in order to progress we had to beat a very strong team from Latchmere (who won their

first match 9-0). The girls raised their game and played a really competitive match with many chances on goal - but again the game ended in a 1-1 draw. Our final match saw a convincing 3-0 win. Looking at the other group games, we were easily in the top 3 teams present, but had an unlucky draw in a tough group. In the league, the girls have started their campaign with a strong performance and win against The Hythe whilst in the cup, a win against Walton Oak has seen the team progress to the league cup semi finals. Finally in the district tournament at Royal Holloway, we entered two teams with both reaching the quarter finals. One team progressed to the semi finals where they faced a very good Cardinal Newman side. The match went to penalties and luck wasn't on our side on this occasion with Cardinal Newman ending up overall tournament winners.


SPECIAL ACHIEVEMENTS/CONGRATULATIONS
