THIS WEEK

October marks Black History Month, where we celebrate the diversity of our community and the significant impact that Black people have achieved, specifically in Britain. This year's theme is 'Reclaiming Narratives.' All year groups will be integrating learning about Black History Month and significant British Black people in their learning throughout October, however we have also had an assembly this week to celebrate and draw attention to the importance of Black History Month, linking it to our school values of inclusiveness and respect. Throughout the year, we will be identifying how we ensure that our curriculum offer reflects the diversity of our community.

Another action packed week in **Year 3!** Children have been enjoying reading 'Fantastic Mr Fox' in Literacy lessons. We have been thinking about how to make our sentences exciting by adding adjectives and adverbs to our descriptions of the greedy farmers. We used thesauruses to find better words for any boring verbs we came across such as 'went', 'got' and 'ate'. In maths we have been using different methods to add and subtract two and three digit numbers. The column method, a number line and a place value grid are three of the methods we have been using to solve our number sentences. We have been exploring animal prints and texture in our art lessons, using Salvador Dali's 'Swans Reflecting Elephants' as our inspiration. In Science we have investigated the forces of gravity and air resistance and how they affect the motion of objects. Topic this week has seen us research and create fact files on some of the physical features found across the UK, such as Ben Nevis, The Giants Causeway and Loch Ness. Year 4 have had a super week. In Art, the children have enjoyed painting their water colour detail onto their previously printed canvas bags and they are looking marvellous! When we come back after half term, the children will start sewing their canvas to make a tote bag. In Science this week, the children have explored condensation as part of our 'States of Matter' unit and have participated excellently with their learning. The children have finished off their 'Warning Stories' this week and have written them up in their Special Writing Books ready to be read at Parent Consultations next week! We are looking forward to our day of outdoor learning next week and the children are getting excited for the

activities that we have planned for them. As always, the Year 4 Team wish you a lovely relaxing weekend.

Year 5 has had a busy week with two classes going on the Hampton Court Palace trip. They learnt about life during the Tudor period and had a chance to walk in the footsteps of royalty, such as Henry VIII and Jane Seymour. They also learnt about the life of the many staff who worked there, which links to our new unit of literacy. Children are currently writing a biography about one of Henry VIII's wives and will soon be writing their own Tudor spy story. In Science, children have carried out an experiment on electrical conductivity by testing different materials in a simple circuit. We have almost completed our unit of RE on Christians and salvation. We are also finishing our unit on dance, where children have created their own routines in the style of the galliard and pavine as well as experimented with modern dance routines. This week in **Year 6** we have thoroughly enjoyed delving into the world of Shakespeare through studying Macbeth. We learned about the characters and plot through a Whoosh and are now focusing on the language and features of the Witches spell 'Double, double, toil and trouble'. We have also been busy filming our Pickpocket news reports, using the green screen. In maths, we have continued with our multiplication and division unit; this week focusing on the bus stop and long division methods. Finally, we have finished the week on a high with 6TS, 6F and 6P enjoying their Outdoor Learning Day and 6B, 6A and 6C experiencing life as a Victorian child.

SCHOOL LUNCHES

We are having an increasing number of children coming into school without a booked lunch or a packed lunch. Please remember to book school dinners on Scopay at least 72 hours in advance and discuss choices with your child so that they are happy with what they are eating. If your child has not got a booked lunch, we will expect that you will provide a packed lunch on that day.

SNACKS

Please remember we have asked that neither snacks or packed lunches should not contain nuts or sesame, which includes hummus. It is a great healthy snack but we have children severely allergic to sesame.

If your child would like a snack at breaktime it must only be fruit or vegetables.

GAME CARDS

Please note that children are not allowed to bring in game cards, such as Pokemon cards or Panini cards. They often get lost or damaged, which is very upsetting for the children. Please ensure that these cards are left at home and do not come into school in their bags.


