THIS WEEK

I had the pleasure of joining the Young Voices trip to the O2 arena yesterday and what a fantastic experience it was for the Year 5/6 children that went. Our pupils sang and behaved beautifully and I am sure they will remember the trip for years to come. For those of you who have children in the lower school, I really recommend it! Many thanks to all the staff who made the trip possible, particularly Ms Tao who coordinated everything!

It's been another busy week in **Year 3** and we have been continuing our literacy unit on Lost and Found. After creating a class story map last week, classes have worked together on a shared write by offering their suggestions and collaborating to produce a high quality piece. Children have then planned their own resolution and ending to the story before writing their hot task and practising editing their work. In maths, we have been focusing on subtracting 3 digit numbers and have then moved on to estimating the position of numbers on a numberline as well as estimating answers, using our knowledge of rounding from a couple of weeks ago. In science, our new topic is Forces and Magnets. Pupils have been carrying out an investigation to compare the amount of friction created by different surfaces and discussing how friction can both help and hinder us. In our topic work, we have been exploring a timeline of world events and learning the difference between dates in BCE (Before the Common Era) and CE (Common Era). Pupils have been working in groups to try and order these events from the earliest to the most recent as well as exploring some key events during the Ancient Egyptian period. In computing, we have been discussing how we can stay safe online and why it's important to keep personal information private. Though we have had a very chilly few days, that has not stopped us having another great week in Year 4. We have started our new Literacy unit where we are writing an explanation text all about the Digestive System. We are using all of the knowledge that we gained from the Science Museum and what we learnt about in Science last term. However, in Science this term we are continuing to study Electricity. We did a fantastic experiment to find out which materials are effective conductors and insulators. We are continuing to build on our gymnastic skills in P.E, where we are using our creativity to choreograph our own routines. We are developing our knowledge of the city states of Ancient Greece in History as we compare Sparta and Athens, understanding how they lived and what were the people's differing viewpoints. The plot of The Iron Man is getting more and more exciting in Whole Class Reading, as all is definitely not what it seems! Well done everyone on a very cold but marvellous week!

A frosty week in **Year 5** saw us continuing with our Pop Art work and focusing on the work of Andy Warhol. We finished our Rollercoaster poems in literacy and have now started a unit of work on creating a narrative from The Firework Maker's Daughter by Phillip Pullman. In maths we have started work on fractions with some reminders of the basics before deepening our understanding. Our Space work also continues with a look at the key figures involved in the Space Race and consideration of the question 'Why do we get seasons?' in Science. Ask us to explain! Year 6 have been hard at work this week. Firstly, we have been looking at the topic of stereotypes in PSHE and in Computing lessons, particularly looking at how we view people and how companies and brands can highly encourage stereotypes via marketing. We have continued looking at plastic in Geography, with focus on the positives and negatives of plastic use, but mainly on the damaging impacts plastic pollution has on the environment. We have become scientists by participating in some fun experiments to look at reversible and irreversible changes in Science.

INTERNET SAFETY GUIDE

Twitter is a social media network which allows users to post short messages ('tweets') of up to 280 characters. Tweets can consist of text, photos, videos, audio, links, polls and GIFs – often linked by hashtags if they share a common theme or message. Hashtags receiving high levels of interest are said to be 'trending'. Twitter users can engage with other people's posts by liking, retweeting (sharing) or tweeting back (commenting on). Since the entrepreneur Elon Musk acquired Twitter in 2022 for \$44 billion, the platform has undergone several major changes.
