This week started with bright smiles and smart uniforms as the children had their photographs taken. Thank you for your support in ensuring the children look smart and have pride in their school appearance by wearing the correct school uniform. Harvest is approaching as the weather takes an autumnal turn and we look forward to 5D leading us in celebrating our harvest festival next Wednesday in St Mary Oatlands Church. As the weather becomes more autumnal, please make

sure that your child has a suitable coat to wear outside.

Year 3 children have been working really hard this week creating their own sentences and thinking about what a sentence must include. We used a video clip about a little bird called Piper to inspire our writing. Children came up with some wonderful adjectives to add description to their sentences. In maths we have continued with our place value work and looked at how we can compare numbers and explain our reasoning behind this. We are very proud of how our children have conducted themselves during our baseline assessments in maths and english. They sat beautifully, focused on the questions asked and tried their best. In our topic lesson we have been exploring maps and looking at the counties that surround Surrey - We wonder if children can remember any to tell you at home? Our science has continued by focusing on magnets and investigating if the size of a magnet has an impact on its strength. Year 3 are settling well into their new classroom routines and we are really pleased with the effort that most are demonstrating. Keep it up Year 3! Another busy week for **Year 4!** The children have continued their learning with place value and have been working hard to understand rounding to the nearest 10 and 100. In Literacy we have been finishing off our Play script writing. The children have really enjoyed writing a scene taken from the story of 'The Boy Who Saved a Bear'. In Geography this week, we revisited our River Walk map and located where different places were using grid references. In Art we are starting to design our waterlily stamps that the children will use to print with on their canvas bags. The children have continued to work really hard this week and the Year 4 team wish you all a restful weekend.

Year 5 had a fantastic start to the week with our reenactment of the Battle of Bosworth as part of our new literacy unit. Each class joined an army -King Richard, Henry or the Stanleys (who hadn't decided whose side they were on!). The children showed an excellent understanding of the events of the battle by getting into character as archers, knights and fleeing soldiers, whilst also being sensible and following our instructions. In maths, we finished our unit on place value and have started looking at different methods of adding. Some classes have explored a chapter of the 'Diary of a Wimpy Kid' in our reading sessions and conducted experiments on the 'stretchiness' of different materials. To finish the week, we have spent our last day trying to avoid the worst of the rain to learn more about worms, which is linked to our next homework task. This week in Year 6, we have started our new 'Pick Pockets' literacy unit during which the children will write a news report about a pickpocketing incident in Victorian London. In maths, we are extending our knowledge of addition and subtraction by solving reasoning and word problems. We have continued learning about the British Empire, looking at why it was so successful and the benefits and negatives it produced. In art, the children have carefully and thoughtfully designed their repeated pattern tile based on the works of William Morris and in science we have learned about invertebrates. Our Victorian immersion days start next Friday with 6P, 6F and 6TS while 6B, 6A and 6C have their outdoor learning day. Have a great weekend, the Year 6 team.

Junior Biathlon - 8th October 2024

Guildford High School are hosting a biathlon on Tuesday 8th October and is open to pupils in years 3, 4, 5 and 6.

Year 3/4 pupils will swim 50m and then run 400m, whilst year 5/6 pupils will swim 100m and then run

800m. Competitors will come out of the pool after their swim, walk to the transition area where they will put on their school PE top and trainers and then complete the run.

Please note, your child must be able to competently swim 50m/100m of a pool where they are out of their depth. This is an important entry requirement.

SCHOOL PHOTOS
