# THIS WEEK

I hope you all had a good half term and have returned rested for what is normally the busiest and most exciting half term of the school year. Despite it being a shorter week for the pupils there has been so much going on with trips out and special days. More of this in the year group news below.

We are also really excited for the return of our much anticipated fireworks night on Sunday. A huge thank you to the many parents who are volunteering their time on Sunday. We look forward to seeing you all there and fingers crossed for dry weather!

It's been another busy week in Year 3 and we have started our new literacy unit based on Shakespeare's play of 'The Tempest' (which seems especially fitting given the current weather conditions this week!) We immersed ourselves in the story by watching the CBeebies production (which is also on iplayer) and a range of drama activities to help us understand the plot. We also looked at the different characters and have started to identify the main features of a diary in preparation for writing a diary entry from the perspective of Caliban next week. In Maths, we have been focusing on money and learning about the different coins, converting pounds and pence and adding and subtracting amounts of money. In science, we have been learning about how the muscles work with our skeleton to help us move. In our topic lesson this week, we have been researching different physical landmarks in the UK, including Loch Ness, The Giant's Causeway and Ben Nevis, and have been creating our own Pokemon Go cards. Our new RE topic is 'What does it mean to be a Hindu?' and we have started our lessons by learning about the festivals of Diwali and Holi and how they are similar and different. We hope everyone who celebrated Diwali over half term had a wonderful time! Year 4 has had a wonderful first week back! We have started our new topic in Maths, looking at measurement and understanding the length of kilometres! We have finished our

fantastic narratives based on the story Paradise Carpet by Jamila Gavin. In Geography, we have been learning about the River Ganges and compared it to the River Thames. We have started to practise our badminton skills and learn the rules of the game in P.E. In Science, we have been comparing different animal teeth and understanding how every type of tooth has a different part to play during the process of digestion. Now we have all finished our beautiful designs of our bags, we are exploring how canvas bags are constructed to help us when we start to sew them. Well done for a great week Year 4 and have a wonderful weekend!

This week in **Year 5** we have started working on our Basketball skills with a focus on passing and working together as a team. We had great fun at the end of the lesson game! In Maths, we have continued on with our multiplication and division unit. We have studied cubed numbers, multiplying by 10 and 100 and applying multiplication knowledge and language to answer problem solving questions. In whole class guided reading we have been captivated by the very mysterious first chapters of a book called The Runner by Keith Gray. Friday saw a spectacular Tudor day - we really loved seeing everyone in their costumes! The children enjoyed participating in some Tudor sport, learning about the art of smelling nice in Tudor times, enjoying some soup tasting including some traditional Tudor pottage and finally learning about ship exploration that happened during this period. Ask us about the ships that we made today! A busy week and Year 6 have been brilliant in coming back to school after half term and settling to work. In Maths, this has been a Review week in which classes have readdressed lessons and units that potentially required more learning to develop their understanding. In Literacy, pupils have completed their hot task on the biography of Marcus Rashford and are beginning to edit and uplevel their work independently which is the requirement in year 6. This week, classes have either been printing their tile design or using the green screen and iPads to film their pickpocket script. Finally, the year group finished their week with a fun interhouse games session.

Amigo is a social platform which purports to connect strangers from around the world – and, with built-in translation software, it reduces the expected language barriers. Focusing heavily on one-to-one chat, video calls and live streams, Amigo encourages its users to build up online relationships to unlock exclusive features such as private video and audio calls: essentially, the more that people chat, the more features become available to them. This is an app designed with mature users very much in mind and is therefore definitely not recommended for children.
