Thank you for helping your child to learn their words and preparing costumes. Everyone looked and sounded great! Next week it is the turn of Year 5/6 to perform. Thank you also to those of you who supported our Christmas Fair last Saturday. It was again extremely well attended and raised valuable funds for the school. Another MASSIVE thank you to everyone who donated a present for a child on the Truly Giving website.

It's been another busy week in **Year 3** and we are continuing to enjoy our literacy unit based on The Polar Express. Pupils have been planning their hot task and drafting a paragraph to describe the Polar Express arriving at the North Pole before uplevelling it. They have also been practising using a thesaurus to look up synonyms for a variety of words. In maths, we have been revisiting objectives we have previously covered and have been

recapping on column addition and subtraction with and without exchanging. In science, we have been learning about soil including the different components in soil and the four processes of soil formation. In topic this week, we have been learning about renewable energy and the difference between this and non-renewable energy as well as discussing the advantages and disadvantages of these. We have also been working really hard on sewing our stockings and want to say another thank you to all of the parents who've been coming along to help - it's much appreciated! We also want to say a HUGE well done to the pupils for their amazing Nativity performance last night - they were brilliant!! We are fast approaching the end of term and what a busy one it has been! In Year 4 this week in maths we have started our unit on Area, where we have been learning what the area of the shape is and what different methods we can use to work it out. We have also started a festive literacy unit focussing on the Letters to Santa by J.R.R Tolkien, we hope they inspire the children to write some creative narratives. Year 4 are continuing to sew their bags in DT and next week you will see all their hard work when they bring them home. And of course we must mention the Christmas concert. The children did incredibly well performing their poem and songs both to year 5 in our dress rehearsal and to parents and families in the evening. We are so proud of them and want to thank all parents/carers for your support with learning lines, providing costumes and coming along on the night to watch. We hope you all enjoyed the concert!

In **Year 5** this week our highlight was making the pottage on Wednesday. The children peeled, chopped and prepared vegetables before they added them into the mixture and cooked their soup - the children worked fantastically well within their team. Thank you to everyone at home that brought ingredients and prepared them for the children - it was much appreciated by us all! We have continued practising our Christmas songs ready for next week - the children are excited to show it off. In literacy, we are coming towards the end of our unit on penguins - the children have fully immersed themselves in everything to do with Emperor Penguins. Did you know they poo every 20 minutes? In RE, we have been discussing the importance of light at Christmas within Christianity

and for other religions. Another busy and full week in **Year 6!** Sewing the Victorian Samplers is in full swing and pupils have also designed their keyring that is being printed on the 3D printers! This has caused great excitement literally watching them being made. Year 6 have also started their Victorian Christmas enquiry using their research skills to inform. Well done to all pupils at their practice rehearsal for the Christmas show, we are looking forward to seeing the real thing on the 13th! We have moved onto position and direction in Maths and children are now editing their writing outcome based on the 2019 Excitable Edgar John Lewis advert.

Great work Megan!


