Homework

Main Tasks:

Main homework- rotates between literacy, topic and science and is handed out on a Friday and returned the following Tuesday.

Spellings:

Spellings will be sent home from next week and tested weekly in class.

Maths:

Homework will begin **after half term** and will be given out weekly. It will consolidate what the children have been learning that week & should take about 30 minutes, depending on the topic and task.

Reading Records:

To be handed in weekly on your child's class library day with their reading book. We expect the children to read at least 3 times a week and for an adult to comment and sign that they have.

EXPECTATIONS:

We are aiming to develop independence and do not expect children to spend more than **an hour** in total completing their reading, spellings and main homework.

Handwriting - why do we focus on it?

The National Curriculum



Statutory requirements

Handwriting

Pupils should be taught to:

- sit correctly at a table, holding a pencil comfortably and correctly
- begin to form lower-case letters in the correct direction, starting and finishing in the right place
- form capital letters
- form digits 0-9
- understand which letters belong to which handwriting 'families' (i.e. letters that are formed in similar ways) and to practise these.

Legible writing that can be produced comfortably at speed and with little conscious effort allows a child to attend to the higher-level aspects of writing composition and content



Handwriting - what are the expectations?


- We follow a scheme called PenPals.
- Year 3 will be doing frequent handwriting lessons throughout the week,
 covering all letters and joins.
- Year 4 will continue this practise in handwriting books with the reward of a pen passport.
- Upper school will recap areas where the children have gaps using PenPals. These sessions will be a maximum of 5 minutes up to 3x a week.
- All year groups will have high aspirations for their children's handwriting.
